Student Technology and Internet Usage Agreement

The School District of Denmark's computer resources are to be used in a responsible, efficient, ethical and legal manner in accordance with the mission statement and goals of the District. To that end, we believe parents and teachers should work together to help students develop the necessary technological skills and attitudes.

Social Media accounts accessed only when directed for use by staff for educational purposes	Using another person's username and password or allowing unauthorized users to use your username and password.
School issued Gmail account to communicate & collaborate for educational purposes only.	Using remote access to other computers/Proxy bypassing (getting past filters)

	Attempting to access unauthorized files or programs
	Other misuses of technology not specifically stated, but implied, through this agreement and/or board policy.

*Cyber bullying includes, but is not limited to: harassing, teasing, intimidating, threatening, or terrorizing another person by sending or posting inappropriate and hurtful email or text messages, digital pictures, or website postings, including blogs and social networking sites. Users are responsible for the appropriateness of material they transmit over the system.

Use of the computers in our schools for programs, software, and to access telecommunication resources is a privilege, not a right. Violations of these guidelines will result in disciplinary action. The District has the right to limit or deny access to technology resources to any student at any time, for any reason.

All communications on, and uses of, the District's technology resources may be monitored from time to time by the District with or without notice. Students should be aware that all communications and uses of the network are not private and that the District has and may exercise the right to review, audit, intercept, and disclose all matters created, transmitted, received, or stored on such resources. No student shall have any expectation of privacy as to his or her use of District technology resources.

As part of our learning this year, we will continue using a suite of secure online applications called G Suite for Education as well as other web tools which teaching staff have determined to be educationally and age appropriate.

Tools include: Gmail, Classroom, Docs, Sheets, Slides, and other appropriate Web Tools

As required by the Child Internet Protection Act ("CIPA"), the District has technology measures and policies in place which protect students from harmful materials. Email and websites are filtered so that content from inappropriate sites is blocked.

Under the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act ("COPPA"), verifiable parental consent is required for students under the age of 13 if accounts containing certain basic information (generally student name, username, and email address) are created for them on third party websites or online services. The law permits schools, such as those in the District, to consent to the collection of this information on behalf of all of its students, thereby eliminating the need for individual parental consent given directly to each website provider.

Limited information for your child consisting of first name, last name, birth date, username and email address may be provided to the online resources for the purpose of securing confidential credentials and access for the student. This information will remain confidential and will not be shared except for providing online programs solely for the benefit of students and the school system.

Under no circumstances will student information be used by third party websites for commercial purposes.

Students who bring privately owned equipment to school are personally responsible for the equipment as well as all security, maintenance, repairs and are subject to the District's technology and internet use policies.

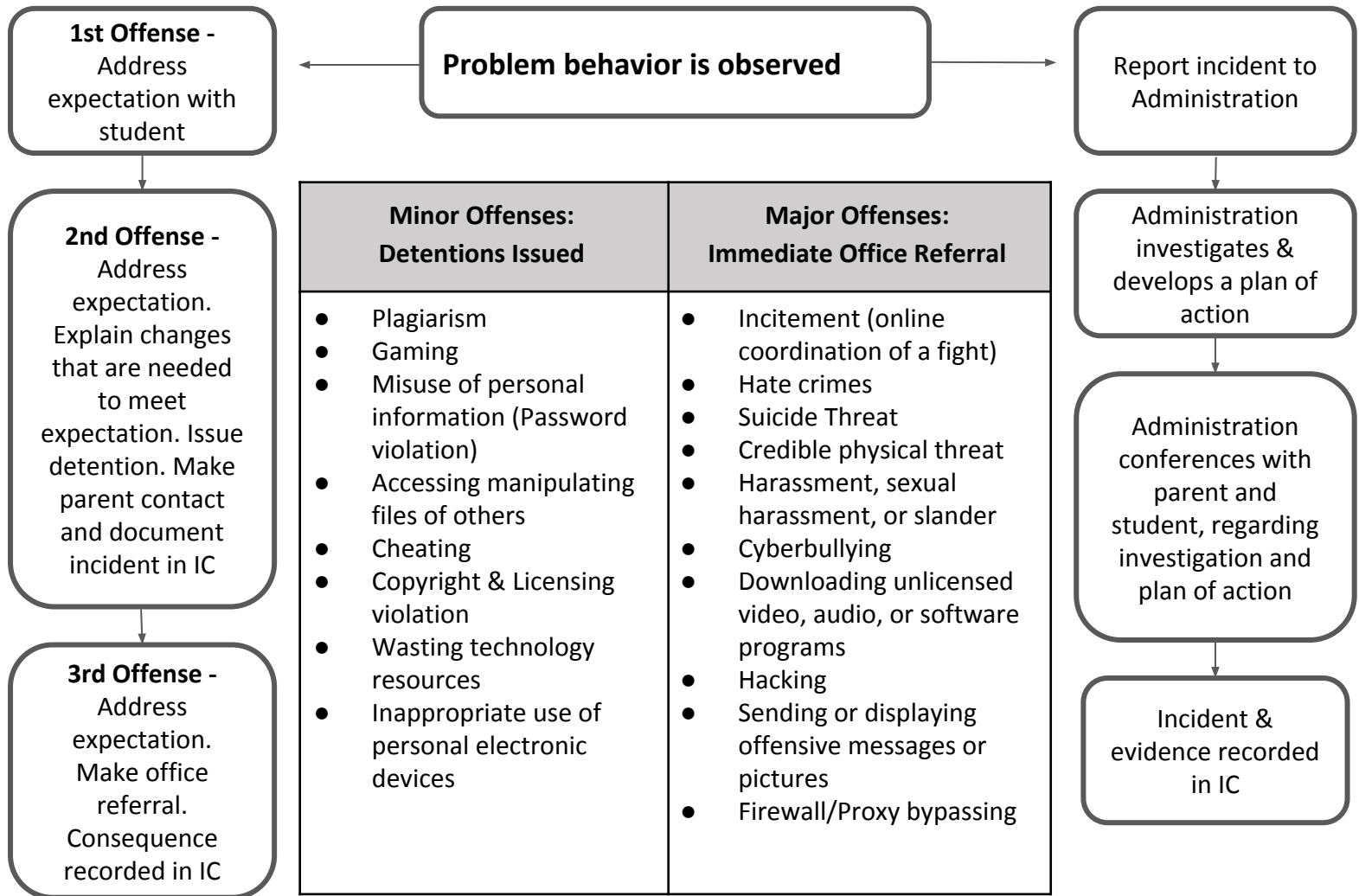
